The opening of the 2013-14 season for The San Antonio Symphony marks a year of celebration, a year of anticipation, and a year of transformation. Next year we will celebrate the 75th anniversary of The San Antonio Symphony. The first event of the celebration will be the 75th Anniversary Concert on June 14, 2014.

The Symphony was created as an independent organization by Max Reiter in 1939. Over the years it has inspired and enriched



Throughout that history, The Symphony League has provided countless hours of volunteer service and has raised over \$2,000,000 for The Symphony. We celebrate not only the 75th anniversary of the Symphony, but also the critical role the League has played through its support of symphonic music in San Antonio.

This year we anticipate the opening of the Tobin Center in 2015. The Tobin Center will transform performing arts in San Antonio and will be the new worldclass venue for The Symphony. The opening of the Tobin Center will provide an opportunity for the League to take part in the Tobin Center's "transformational catalyst – for the performing arts, for children, for downtown." This year will be a year of transformation for the League because of numerous opportunities to collaborate with The Symphony, The Youth Orchestra, and with groups that promote symphonic music. This transformation will include an increased role for The League in The Symphony's support of musical education.

Volunteer Symphony Office Receptionists Needed

League members serve as the sole receptionists in the downtown Symphony Business Office, 7-8 hours everyday, throughout the year. In addition to phone work, these volunteers greet all who come into the Symphony Office, directing them to the appropriate person or office. Additionally, they are regularly called on to assist with filing, folding and stuffing mail-outs, posting and mailing, research projects and maintaining archives. Parking is provided.

Currently, there is an opening to fill Thursdays on a permanent bi-monthly basis. Additionally, substitutes are needed to relieve the five permanent daily volunteers for days off, vacations or emergencies. A one-on-one orientation session is provided to League volunteers who enjoy being close to the inner workings of a strong, active Symphony Office. Year-end Treasurer's Report

The San Antonio Symphony League's Fiscal Year runs from July 1 to June 30 of each year. I am pleased to report to you that the most current fiscal year, ending June 30, 2013, was one of the best years in recent memory. We ended the year with a cash balance of \$149,775.54. This was an increase of \$47,639 over the previous year! Most remarkable is that this increase occurred AFTER our donation of \$160,000 to the San Antonio Symphony. How did we get there? Here are some of the specific numbers:

Clearly, the financial success of the past year was due to the large 2013 Belle Class and financial success of the 2013 Presentation Ball. Since the 2014 Belle class will be significantly smaller than the 2013, the SASL Executive Committee decided to take a portion of the 2013 Ball profit and establish a "reserve" for the following year (2014). That fund stands at just under \$50,000 and will help allow the League to stablize our annual donation to the San Antonio Symphony...
